#### CONFERENCE REGISTRATION PROCEDURE REVISED

The Board has voted to make a procedural change in way our members register for Lions District, State and International events. We are asking, from here on out, that each member send in her own registration form with the appropriate payment, instead of trying to register MLLC attendees as a group. Most events are now requiring a separate form for each participant instead of the group registration forms used in years past. The Club will then reimburse the conference registration fee, up to \$15, for members in good standing (i.e. current on dues) as of the date of registration. Individual registration will eliminate the accounting problems which have arisen with keeping track of the "extras" like meals, shirts and 50/50 tickets which are also ordered on the conference registration form. #### MILLION TREE PROJECT MOVING FORWARD

The Manassas Lioness Lions will be partnering with the Manassas Host Lions Club and the Linton Hall Leo Club to participate in Lions International's Million Tree Campaign. Our goal is to plant five groves of about 10 trees each along Godwin Dr. between Wellington Rd. and Ashton Ave. (in the area of the 7-Eleven, La Petite Academy and the car wash).



Planting date is set for **Saturday, March 31**, between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m., with a back-up date of April 14 in case of inclement weather. Assorted varieties of trees are being provided for the program by Project Releaf in Fairfax, at no charge.
